HIPAA EDI Transaction Questionnaire for Trading Partners

Introduction

This document includes questions that CenCal Health requests to be answered by trading partners prior to submitting or receiving HIPAA EDI transactions. All questions assume the adoption of the ASC X12N National Electronic Data Interchange Transaction Set Implementation Guides v 4010 A1 (October Addenda). 1. General Questions

1. Do you have any Trading Partner Agreements? If so please provide.
2. Do you have a companion documents? If so please provide.
3. Which formats do you support for inbound and outbound (e.g. 837, 835)? Which versions do you support (e.g. v4010 Addenda)?
4. When do you expect to be fully compliant for transactions?
5. Do you currently have PGP capabilities to encrypt/decrypt files. If so please provide PGP key

2. Inbound Transaction (e.g. 837) Questions

1. What is your sender's ISAID(ISA06), GSID(GS02). Can they be the same?
2. Can you read an acknowledgement (e.g. 997/TA1)?
3. For each form, how often will files be sent?
4. Please list all providers you are submitting for (Medical provider#'s)
5. Which programs (e.g. SBHI) are you submitting for?
6. What, if any Certification has been done?
6. What level of testing do you do for certification/acknowledgements.

3. Outbound Transaction (e.g. 835/277/271) Questions

1. Do you have any Additional Requirements (e.g. required fields which are normally situational)?
2. What is your receiver's ISAID(ISA08), GSID(GS03). Can they be the same?
3. What is your File Size limit?
4. What are the Max ST/SE, GS/GE that you can accept?
5. Please provide a List of Providers you want data included for as well as Programs (SBHI, PP2, HFP), and claim categories (Hospital, Medical, Drug), if applicable
6. Can you return an acknowledgement (e.g. 997 w/ TA1 segment)?
7. How long do you want files to be available on our FTP server (including acknowledgements)? Typically we want to keep files on our server and allow the trading partner to download them.
