Dear Majority Leader Thune, Speaker Johnson, Chairman Crapo, Chairman Guthrie,  
and Chairman Smith,

As your constituent, I urge you to vote no on the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" or any other reconciliation proposal that would cut Medicaid. This is not just a matter of policy—it's a matter of life and death for over 80 million Americans, including more than 1 in 5 people in our country who depend on Medicaid for their well-being.

The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) has outlined the dire consequences of this legislation, warning that it could strip millions of individuals of their health insurance. These are our friends, family members, and neighbors who desperately need access to care. They are one of us.

The Medicaid provisions proposed and included in the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" are dangerous and life-threatening. These provisions, which the CBO estimates would terminate Medicaid and CHIP coverage for at least 10 million people and leave 7.8 million people who have Medicaid uninsured, would impact hospitals, health centers, and our local economy. Taken together, they would negatively impact the health care delivery system for everyone, regardless of insurance status.

The challenges the Senate faces during the budget reconciliation process are significant, and it's understandable that these must be addressed thoughtfully. As your constituent, I urge Congress to protect Medicaid by rejecting the Medicaid cuts contained in "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" and any proposals to reduce or eliminate Medicaid benefits.
