Why Communities Trust Local Plans

Local plans are built to serve the people who face the greatest barriers to care.

What Local Plans Deliver

- **Community voice** through advisory groups and local governance.
- **Culturally responsive care** via CHWs, promotoras, and community based programs.
- **Social needs integration** including housing supports, food security, and transportation.
- **Local reinvestment** that strengthens neighborhoods and reduces disparities.

How Local Plans Advance Equity

- Use **granular local data** to target disparities with local guidance from community advisory boards.
- Fund **community-specific programs** that reflect cultural and linguistic needs.
- Build **cross-sector partnerships** with housing, justice, education, and youth organizations.
- Support **trusted messengers** who improve engagement and outcomes.

Bottom Line: Local plans make equity **real**, not rhetorical or theoretical.
