

Fact Sheet: UIS Members Depend on Managed Care



CenCal Health is the local health plan that provides coverage to over 231,000 Medi-Cal members in Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo counties, which accounts for one in three residents in Santa Barbara County and one in four in San Luis Obispo County. Approximately 17% of our members, over 38,700 individuals, hold unsatisfactory immigration status, commonly referred to as undocumented.

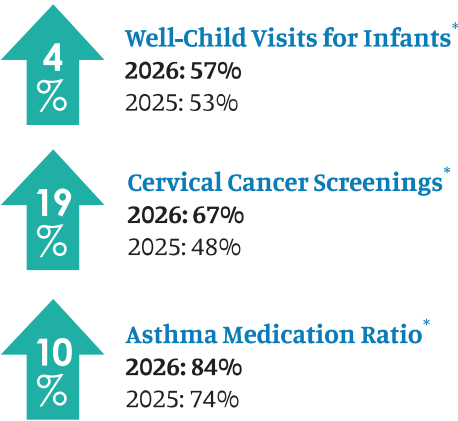
Prevalence of Chronic Conditions in the UIS Population

Many Medicaid beneficiaries with chronic health conditions require ongoing treatment. Among CenCal Health's more than 38,700 members with unsatisfactory immigration status, nearly 12,000 — approximately 30% — live with chronic conditions.

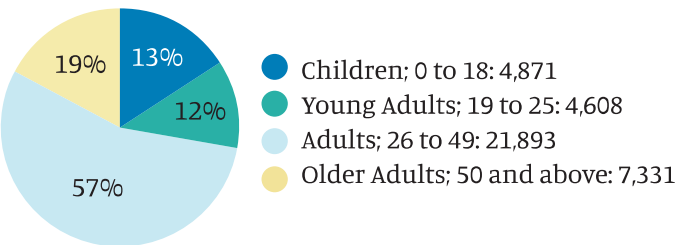
Quality Improvements
